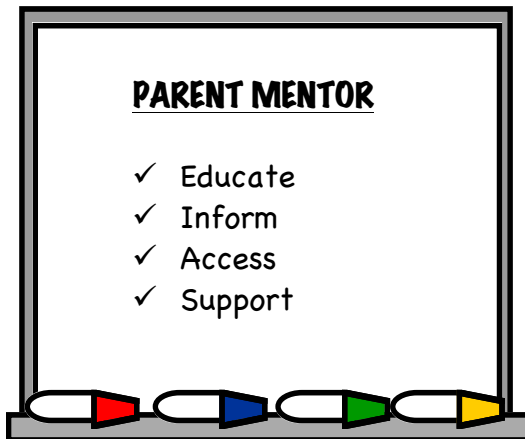


As Partners

- **EDUCATE** families and schools about the special education process;
- **INFORM** parents of their legal rights and answer questions about special education;
- **ACCESS** services in the school and community;
- **SUPPORT** parents and school personnel through this process.



The Parent Mentor will support families and school staff in a variety of ways including:

- Explaining the IEP (Individual Education Program) process and the parents' role in the development of the IEP.
- Improving communication between parents and school.
- Organizing and conducting workshops.
- Attending IEP, ETM (Evaluation Team Meeting) and other school meetings with families.
